Please be sure that all airplanes are hangared every night. If you leave the plane on the ramp during the day make sure it's back in at night. If you have trouble call Joan or Al. There is a motorized tow bar in the 382 hangar now if you need it.

As we fly in this cold and wet season, be sure to get a <u>complete</u> weather briefing, check carefully for water condensate in the fuel tanks, and if you've been parked out on the ramp somewhere, clear <u>all</u> the frost from the airplane before you power up. And know and respect your personal minimums!

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
