# Some Reminders...

- When 5ED was being check, it was noticed that it shows signs of being over-primed. For the C-172s, the following are good rules of thumb: 2 pumps on normal days, 3 on very cold days, 0 pumps if the engine is already hot. If it doesn't start on the first try, only then give another pump.
- Remember that the fuel tanks do not need to be topped off in the warmer weather. As the fuel warms up and expands, it just drips out the fuel vent line and is wasted.
- April held several great days as a teaser of the wonderful weather that is coming! On days where the temperature is over 90°F, please only do a couple touch and goes in a row. If you want to practice, it is best to hop between the many, wonderful local airports after every 2-3 take-offs to allow the engine to cool down. Protect yourself and the plane, keep an eye on that oil temperature, and have fun hopping between the great airports the valley has to offer.
