
Cancelling because it's below VFR minimums? Please remember to cancel your reservation so that those who fly in IFR conditions can use the planes.

After many delays, the Aurora Tower is now open and the Class D airspace is in effect. The Airport Facility Directory and Sectionals and other forms of paper notification will have the change noted on their next publication date. Until then:

Tower/ Local Control: 120.35 Ground Control: 119.15 ASOS/ ATIS: 118.252

Diameter of Main Class D Airspace: 5nm, 2700 MSL Class D around Lendhardt: 3.3nm, 1200 to 2700 MSL
