Check your aircraft ID in flight plans

After getting a clearance recently in N12382 the tower let me know that a few times in the past the airplane ID that had been filed in the system was "Q12382" and that they had been changing the call sign to "N12382" before issuing the clearance. I contacted Leidos Flight Service and they informed me that as required by ATC, they will prepend a "Q" when no country code is used in the filed aircraft call sign.

They looked up the recent flight plan history for 382 and found a few flight plans from PilotWeb, Flight Service Mobile Web, and Garmin Pilot that were filed as just "12382". With that in mind, double check your aircraft profiles in Garmin Pilot, ForeFlight, and 1800wxbrief.com to make sure you have an "N" prefix in all your club airplane call signs.

N515ED avionics upgrade

While plans are in place to upgrade the Skylane's avionics in 2021, an opportunity has also presented itself to upgrade some of the avionics in N515ED to the latest Garmin products. The GTN 750 and GTN 650 navigators will be replaced with the new GTN 750Xi and GTN 650Xi units. Additionally, the GMA 35 audio panel will be replaced with a new GMA 35c that has built-in Bluetooth connectivity so you can wirelessly connect your phone and audio devices to the audio panel.



The GTN Xi features and user interface are nearly identical to the GTN, so the transition will be very easy. We expect to configure the new GTN Xi features

sometime in January, so watch your email and future newsletters for more specifics on the new features that you'll be able to use.

Proposed bylaw changes

As mentioned in the December newsletter, the following proposed changes to the Bylaws will be voted on by the membership at the 2021 Annual Business Meeting in January. The changes add a Chief Pilot position to the Board of Directors. The Chief Pilot will focus on the operational safety and flight operations while the Safety and Maintenance Officer will focus on the aircraft safety and maintenance. The proposed changes are:

Article IV - Board of Directors

Section 1:

• Change the Board of Directors to consist of six members instead of five members.

Section 2:

- Add Chief Pilot to the Board of Directors.
- Add "The Chief Pilot shall be appointed by a vote of the other Directors; the term of the Chief Pilot shall be 2 years and shall align with the terms of the Vice-President and Secretary."

Section 5:

• Add "The Chief Pilot shall be a non-voting Director."

Article V - Officers

Section 1:

Add Chief Pilot.

Add Section 8:

• The Chief Pilot shall review and implement pilot operational safety measures for the Corporation including, but not limited to, assisting the Board of Directors with managing member proficiency and qualifications, reviewing Membership Flight Rules, providing training opportunities to club members, and coordinating approved flight instructors.

Article VII - Accidents

Section 3:

- Change Safety Officer to Chief Pilot (2 places).
- In last sentence, change "log book endorsement" to "log book entry".

Section 4:

Change Safety Officer to Chief Pilot (2 places).
