On Saturday the 15th we flew to Woodland State Airport in Woodland, WA (W27). All the club airplanes (minus the 182) made the journey to the 1,953' x 25' runway. W27 is located 60 miles north of Salem between Vancouver and Kelso, WA. And you've probably noticed the airport alongside I-5 while driving to Seattle. The winds were calm which made for a mild approach to the runway. After securing the airplanes, we made the five-minute walk to Daddy D's BBQ.

New visual procedures at Boeing Field

If you're planning to join the July 24th club flyout to Boeing Field (KBFI), or you're just flying there for other reasons, be aware that there have been changes to the VFR arrival and departure procedures at the airport. The new procedures replaced two existing VFR routes with new ones and went into effect on May 15th.

The avionics upgrade for N70574 is in full swing. As you can see in the photo below, this is a major gutting of all the avionics and nearly all the wiring in the aircraft. weekly communication with the shop to address questions and to receive updates. Although we'd love to have the plane back online now, the wait will definitely be worth it.
