Aircraft care: tires



The club has been having issues with tires recently, including flats and worn spots. Our mechanic has suggested that at least

some of those issues could be because the tires are underinflated. That allows them to shift on the rim, possibly damaging them.

To increase safety and help to reduce the club's maintenance costs, please keep these points in mind:

- During pre-flight, make sure the tires are inflated to the proper pressures, as listed in the POH. We have at least two compressors available in the hangars to top off tires that are low.
- After a flight, check the tires for any new wear or damage, like new flat spots. This is especially important if you had a 'challenging' landing and skidded or braked heavily.
- Keep proficient on crosswind landings, to minimize sideloading and avoid skidding. If you aren't comfortable with crosswind techniques, it may be worthwhile to get a refresher from an instructor.
