Fuel surcharges update



Fuel prices have come down a little in a few locations near Salem, however the price at KSLE itself hasn't changed. and we're keeping the surcharges unchanged for now:

- Skyhawks/Cherokee: \$5.10/hr.
- Skylane: \$7.80/hr.

Safety is still our top priority, but with Salem still at \$7/hr please consider refueling at another local airport if possible. For example, Twin Oaks (7S3) is currently at \$5.99/gal., a saving of \$13.13/hr. in the club 182.

Aircraft update: N515ED and N12382

The new engine has been installed in N515ED, but we are still working on the engine break-in. Unfortunately, the weather has made the engine break-in more challenging. The types of flights and who is authorized to fly during this time is limited. We do need help building low-altitude cross-country break-in hours following careful procedures. If you are interested in helping build these hours at a reduced hourly rate of \$71/hr, please contact Chris Eriksson or Isaac Mosgrove. Once the engine breakin has been completed, N515ED will be put back online in Flight Circle.

N12382's engine installation has been rescheduled to the mid-February or March timeframe to help with the shop's availability and to help avoid having two aircraft offline at the same time.

We have gutters!

We've been working with the airport, City of Salem, and other experts on an overall strategy to address the challenges with water build-up around the hangars, on the aprons, and on the grounds surrounding the hangars. A comprehensive, multiphase solution has been created. The first phase has now been completed by adding new fascia boards, gutters, and downspouts to the hangars. The goal is to complete the other phases in 2023 when the ground is not so waterlogged. Big thanks go out to Will Horsey, Vern Johnson, and Isaac Mosgrove for their help with this effort.
